RE: State Unemployment Benefits for Contract Workers

Dear Assemblymember Mayes,

The Greater Coachella Valley Chamber of Commerce (GCVCC) writes today out of concern for our Coachella Valley contractors that are experiencing significant difficulties applying for unemployment insurance. As you are aware, gig economy, contract and furloughed workers were included in the recent federal \$2.2 trillion relief package passed by Congress. While the federal government has stated they would qualify for unemployment benefits for the first time during the coronavirus pandemic, they remain in limbo inside the State of California.

We understand that the State of California Employment Development Department is awaiting clarification from the Labor Department about precisely who qualifies and what documentation is required. We would encourage the State to be proactive in this matter and aggressively pursue these parameters, even if it requires forging ahead without Federal guidance. The State of California has on many occasions that they are willing to act on behalf of their citizens, even when the Federal Government has lagged in their own efforts. This is one of those moments that may require similar leadership on the part of our State.

While people will receive benefits backdated to when they became unemployed because of the coronavirus, this does not offer relief to those suffering significant financial burdens now. Our independent contractors were already facing significant change and uncertainty due to AB5, our current state of emergency will only add to that anxiety and hardship.

The Greater Coachella Valley Chamber of Commerce supports these independent contractors in their efforts to receive the benefits rightfully owed to them, and we hope that you can use your position to help expedite the process for delivery.
